European wasp and bee procedure

Updated 21-2-2023

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide strategies to minimise the potential hazards associated with European wasps.

Strategies for Prevention

- 1. At fruit time and lunchtime, the children will eat inside when wasps/bees are prevalent.
- 2. In summer months, staff will minimise outside water play when wasps/bees are prevalent.
- 3. Staff will ensure compost bins are firmly closed and not emitting a strong smell.
- 4. Staff will educate the children about European wasps/bees through stories and discussions.
- 5. Utilise the 'Invacuation' practice to alert children to the potential danger of European wasps/bees.
- 6. Encourage children to identify wasps/bees and alert staff when wasps/bees are present.
- 7. Staff will emphasise to children the importance of informing a staff member if they have been stung.
- 8. Staff will ensure children are wearing appropriate footwear at all times, with the exception being the sandpit.
- 9. Staff will alert parents / caregivers to the presence of wasps at the centre.
- 10. Staff will check with the local Council if nest have recently been located.
- 11. Staff will notify the Council if they feel there may be nests located across the road at the river.
- 12. If wasps/bees are swarming, staff with contact a local pest controller to seek assistance.

First Aid Procedures

Please note: Children's health information must be kept up to date to prevent the risk of allergic reactions occurring.

- 1. If a child has been stung, staff will apply an ice pack to the bite area.
- 2. Staff will notify the parent / caregiver.
- 3. If swelling or a suspected allergic reaction is detected, staff will seek immediate medical advice.
- 4. Follow child's ASCIA anaphylaxis plan if they are allergic to bees/wasps
- 5. Fill out incident/injury trauma form
